LifeJourney Responds to Famine in Our World

Eastern Africa is in the midst of a famine that is wreaking havoc on the people of Somalia, Kenya, and the Horn of Africa.

LifeJourney Church tries to respond with the love of Christ when emergency situations like this occur. Because of your generous giving, we have been able to provide \$2,000 in assistance. **\$1,000 is going to CARE,** a humanitarian organization fighting global poverty. CARE's efforts include emergency aid to individuals, especially children, who are suffering from malnutrition and other medical problems. Families are given food and essentials including tents, firewood, stoves and access to food distributions in Ethiopia, Somalia, and Kenya.

Another \$1,000 is going to Oxfam, which is providing water and sanitation for displaced people and giving life-saving equipment to Somalia's only children's hospital. In Kenya and Ethiopia, Oxfam is giving people money through cash-for-work projects to build water tanks and reservoirs and is trucking in water supplies and treating water for drinking, cooking, and washing.

And here at home...

We're also responding to hunger and poverty here at home. **Today and next Sunday** we will collect donations for the food pantry at the Damien Center, which assists people affected by HIV/ AIDS. They especially need:

- **meats**, including canned chicken or Spam (but not tuna)
- canned entrees (beef stew, chunky soup, chicken/dumplings)
- **canned fruit** (peaches, pears, fruit cocktail, applesauce)
- toiletries (razors and shaving cream, bath soap, shampoo)
- toilet paper and laundry detergent.

You can bring these items to the collection point in the social hall **next Sunday, August 14,** or any day this week that the church is open. (See the calendar on page three for evening activities.)

Children's Sermon Change

The children's ministry at LifeJourney Church is experiencing such explosive growth, we're going to need to make some program changes. One of the most visible changes will be elimination of the weekly children's sermon, so parents can check their kids into their Sunday School classroom directly before service and kids can have more time in their class. We may miss the energy kids bring to the start of each service, but these changes are important for our kids.

- Safety. Dismissing 30 children at once during worship, then returning near the end of worship creates risk that a child will not get to or from class safely. We're moving to a direct check-in/ check-out system for children. Safety first!
- **Quality of Learning.** Our kids will greatly benefit from spending more time together and with their teachers as they learn vital spiritual principles at an age-appropriate level.



• Explosive Growth. A children's sermon works well with 5 to 10 kids. But now we routinely have 20-40 each Sunday. Logistics (and keeping their attention!) is far more difficult with a large group.

So it's time we moved to the next level in our children's programing. **On August 14, children will begin their direct check-in/check-out.** We'll still get to experience the joy of seeing our children in worship when the children's choir sings. Special arrangements will also be made for children who participate on the Communion Teams. Also, on the first Sunday of each month, kids will stay in the sanctuary with their parents until sermon time, when they'll be dismissed to go to Blast Off Worship.

Our new format will also give folks the opportunity to serve by doing what they love. Workshops will now be offered in artwork, environmental issues, cooking, acting/directing, puppetry, and storytelling, to name a few. Helping our homeless neighbors

The **Homeless Ministry** has teamed up with **Dayspring Center** to assist families who are in crisis. Dayspring Center operates 24/7, offering the essentials of food, clothing, and shelter.

The Homeless Ministry provides breakfast on the third Saturday of each month. Team member Greg McMullen describes what the team does: "We cook breakfast in the Dayspring Center kitchen, preparing items as varied as egg casserole, pancakes and fruit salad, and biscuits and gravy — you do not have to be Julia Child to help on our team! We then serve our meal to the families, and it's rewarding when the kids or parents come back for seconds, thirds and even fourths! They're always so appreciative of our efforts to nourish their bodies, while we appreciate the opportunity to nourish our own souls."
